# **Ireland's Historic Homes & Glorious Gardens**

Dear Members and Friends of The Metropolitan Museum of Art,

With its Georgian mansions, splendid interiors, sweeping terraces, hidden hollows, and lush gardens set against dramatic backdrops, Ireland profoundly inspires me as a historic homes scholar. Join me this autumn for exclusive behind-the-scenes access to Ireland's most beautiful ancestral estates and gardens, from coast to coast, in the company of their owners. We will enjoy inside looks at their lovingly preserved paintings, sculptures, and period furnishings collected over generations.

Our program features accommodations in historic castles and estates, including Dromoland, Ireland's "most magical address," with ties to Brian Boru, one of the last High Kings of Ireland, as well as Lyrath Estate, 170 acres of Irish countryside complete with picturesque lakes, historic gardens, and emerald woodlands.

We'll begin in Dublin with a private tour of the National Botanic Gardens, where we'll admire exquisitely restored glasshouses and Victorian plant houses. Later, we'll visit Trinity College, Ireland's oldest university, to see the Old Library and marvel at *The Book of Kells* on an exclusive tour led by the Director of Conservation. We'll also delight in a curator-led tour of the National Gallery of Ireland and view magnificent works by Caravaggio and Vermeer, as well as many esteemed Irish artists.

On the way to the charming medieval town of Kilkenny, we'll stop at Russborough House one of Ireland's finest great houses—for a private tour, followed by lunch on the banks of the Blessington Lakes. Later, in Kilkenny, we'll view Kilkenny Castle and St. Canice Cathedral before meeting a renowned portrait artist-in-residence. After a private tour of Ballintubbert Gardens, Ireland's only certified organic ornamental garden, we'll receive a private reception from Lord and Lady Rosse at Birr Castle, the family's home for 400 years. We'll conclude in Galway to discover Kylemore Abbey, an imposing castle with an exceptional Victorian walled garden.

In addition, we'll share in meals at Michelin-starred restaurants, a private tour and tasting at a preeminent whiskey distillery, and a visit to the dramatic Cliffs of Moher. Don't miss this immersion into the art-filled, rarefied world of Ireland's landed gentry.

### Traveling with You Alice W. Schwarz



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- Take a guided tour of Trinity College, Ireland's oldest university, and its Old Library, where
  you will see The Book of Kells with the Director of Conservation

# Departure

Wednesday, September 27 Depart for Dublin on an overnight flight.

# **Dublin, Ireland**

Thursday, September 28

Arrive this morning and transfer to the hotel. After an included lunch (*depending on your arrival time into Dublin*), walk through the famously restored historic greenhouses at the National Botanical Gardens during a private tour that includes 300 endangered plant species. Gather later for a welcome reception at the hotel. (L), R

# Dublin

#### Friday, September 29

This morning, visit Trinity College, Ireland's oldest university, founded by Queen Elizabeth I in 1592 and modeled after the universities at Oxford and Cambridge. On a guided tour led by the Director of Conservation, see the Old Library, home to more than 200,000 of Ireland's oldest books and historical documents, and marvel at The Book of Kells. Ireland's greatest cultural treasure, a medieval manuscript handcrafted by Irish monks around 800 A.D. After lunch at leisure, continue to St. Patrick's Cathedral, begun in 1191 to honor Ireland's patron saint, who baptized Christian converts using an ancient well on this site. Return to the hotel for a traditional afternoon tea. This evening, enjoy dinner on your own in one of Dublin's acclaimed restaurants. B, T

# Dublin / Enniskerry / Dublin


Saturday, September 30

Take a short walk from the hotel to the National Gallery of Ireland, where a curator will show us its masterpieces, including Caravaggio's dramatic The Taking of Christ and Vermeer's Lady Writing a Letter with her Maid, as well as works by Irish artists. Among its 16,000 pieces are works from Rembrandt, Monet, Picasso, Titian, and Degas, as well as a wide selection from Italian Baroque, Dutch masters, and Irish artists. After lunch at leisure, transfer to the 47-acre Powerscourt House & Gardens, an 18th-century stately home with spectacularly landscaped gardens, a Palladian villa, and waterfalls. The visit to the grounds, which were influenced by the Italian Renaissance and the great estates of France and Germany, includes the home and garden. At the Powerscourt Distillery, savor a dram of Irish whiskey and a food pairing experience. Gather for dinner tonight at a restaurant near the hotel. B, D

# Dublin / Russellstown / Balinakill / Kilkenny

Sunday, October 1

Depart Dublin and travel south to the charming medieval town of Kilkenny. En route, in Russellstown, stop at Russborough House, which sits in the heart of the panoramic West Wicklow landscape, for a private tour. The plasterwork, furnishings, and landscaped gardens—including the delightful Lady's Island—make Russborough House one of the finest great houses in Ireland. Lunch will be at the Tulfarris Hotel, an 18th-century manor house set amid 200 acres on the banks of Blessington Lakes. In the village of Ballinakill, visit Heywood Gardens, a tranquil and romantic hillside escape with a vista that

takes in seven counties. In Kilkenny, enjoy dinner and a two-night stay at the Lyrath Estate, which features 170 acres of Irish countryside complete with picturesque lakes and historic gardens. B, L, D

# **Kilkenny**

#### Monday, October 2

Enjoy a special morning walking tour of Kilkenny, strolling its delightfully tangled narrow streets filled with charming shops. Stop to view the remarkably well-preserved 13th-century St. Canice's Cathedral, the second largest in Ireland after St. Patrick's and an important site for Christian worship for over 1,400 years. Visit the grand 12th-century Kilkenny Castle, built to control a fording part of the River Nore and the junction of several routeways, which now includes an art gallery. This afternoon, visit the Butler Gallery, where the director will provide a private tour of the gallery, originally an almshouse built in 1818, and the magical gardens. You will be introduced to the renowned portrait artist-inresidence as they are working on a portrait. Dinner is included at a famed restaurant that features works by local artists. B, D

# Kilkenny / Ballintubbert / Birr / Galway

Tuesday, October 3

Depart the Lyrath Estate this morning and head to Galway. Stop at Ballintubbert Gardens, Ireland's only certified organic ornamental garden, for a private tour. Later this afternoon, arrive at Birr Castle for a private tour of the house and gardens from Lord and Lady Rosse, whose family has resided here for 400 years. The gardens are home to an abundance of rare plants collected by the Earls of Rosse worldwide over the last 150 years. Arrive at the hotel in Galway where the rest of the evening is at leisure. B, L

# Galway / Pollacappul / Ballynahinch / Newmarket-on-Fergus

#### Wednesday, October 4

In the tiny townland of Pollacappul, visit the stunning Kylemore Abbey, an imposing 19th-century lakeside castle surrounded by Connemara's untamed wilderness and featuring a Victorian walled garden. Have lunch at the lovely Ballynahinch Castle, set in 700 acres of woodlands in the heart of

Connemara and shadowed by the beautiful 12 Bens Mountains. Venture to Newmarketon-Fergus for your two-night stay at Dromoland Castle. During an afternoon at leisure on the 450-acre estate, enjoy the beautiful castle, grounds, and amenities, which include archery, falconry, golf, and clay shooting. Dinner is included at the hotel this evening. B, L, D

# Newmarket-on-Fergus / Liscannor

#### Thursday, October 5

You have the morning to relax and enjoy Dromoland Castle and its offerings. This afternoon, enjoy the stunning countryside and see enchanting villages nestled along the coast as you travel along a portion of the Wild Atlantic Way, which, at 1,600 miles, is one of the longest defined coastal routes in the world. In the coastal village of Liscannor, revel in the spectacular visuals at the Cliffs of Moher, a UNESCO World Heritage Site formed 320 million years ago. These cliffs sit astride the striking landscape of the Burren on one side and the Atlantic Ocean on the other. Later, return to the hotel for a festive farewell reception and dinner. B. L. R. D
